

2019 Molalla Alumni College Scholarship

This scholarship is funded from the donations of Alumni of MHS and individuals in the Molalla community.

The Alumni Association of Molalla High School is proud to be able to offer these scholarships to any graduating MRSD senior who wishes to further his or her education at any accredited post high school institution. If you are going to a community college as a step to receive an Associates Degree and then continue to a 4-year college or university, use this application on which to apply.

Award: *Multiple awards* given—a minimum of \$1,500.00 each—including seven named scholarships—The Damm-Waiste, The Marquardt, The Trullinger/Sanden, The Rebekah Lodge, The Fry Family, The Schriever Family, and The Daniels Family—additional scholarships given at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee.

Eligibility: A current senior attending Molalla High School or affiliated charter school who has maintained at least a 3.0 accumulated weighted GPA.

Where: Any accredited institution of higher learning, community college, 4-year college, or university.

Selection Based On:

1. Scholastic record
2. Community and school involvement
3. Personal character
4. Ability to organize application and follow directions
5. Ability to communicate clearly and succinctly

Deadline: Application may be mailed (MASF P.O. Box 1050; Molalla) but must arrive on or before 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 3, 2019. You may also hand deliver them to Joan Deardorff at Doubletree's office in the Mainstreet Showhouse, 115 E. Main Street, Suite #9 Molalla.

Procedure:

1. Complete **all** the information required on the application, sign it
2. Staple application pages together in this order (please, **no folders**)
 - Cover page
 - Essays
 - Activities
 - Letters of recommendation—must have two
 - Certified high school transcript (2-sided copy acceptable) through second trimester
 - Community College transcript, if college-level course taken
 - Explanation of absences if more than 10 days yearly or any unusual circumstances not explained in essays**
 - Checklist
3. The scholarship winners will be selected by the Scholarship Committee and will be notified at the date of your Senior Awards.

Awarding Scholarship:

1. **Recipient** must verify high school graduation by the enrollment in a post high school educational institution. This verification must include the institution, college or university registrar's copy of their enrolled classes along with your student ID number. The award will be drafted in the form of a check made out to your account at the institution, college or university at which you are enrolled.
2. Termination of the students' college program will result in the cancellation of the award.

Attach to your application, one letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach, counselor, or administrator from your school. **This person must identify himself or herself**, their position at school, and what relationship they have with you. (If this is not done by the person composing the letter of recommendation, please write who this person is and how they know you on the bottom of their letter **before** attaching it to your application.)
2. Also attach to your application, one letter of recommendation from an adult who is **not related** and is **outside** of the school setting. **This person must identify himself or herself** and how he/she knows you and the circumstances for your relationship with this person. (If this is not done by the person composing the letter of recommendation, please write who this person is and how they know you on the bottom of their letter before attaching it to your application.) [i.e. Church youth pastor, Camp Fire advisor, Boy Scout advisor, doctor, family friend, etc.] **NOTE:** Your personal friend, although an adult, **may not** write this letter.
3. On a separate sheet of paper, please explain any unusual absences or circumstances not otherwise explained in your application or essays of which the committee members should be aware.
